

## 2025 SOUTHEASTERN YOUTH FAIR HORSE SHOW

### **NO DOGS ALLOWED NO STALLIONS**

1. The SEYF General Rules & Regulations apply to this show.
2. The Florida 4-H Horse Show Rules will govern this show. Rules are available at the 4-H office.
3. Show is open to all 4-H and FFA youth in good standing between the ages of 8 – 18 residing in Marion County.
4. The participant must manage at least one (1) horse of any age or breed as a 4-H or FFA Horsemanship Project and complete a project record book.

### **SHOW DAY**

5. The SEYF may allow for replacement of a horse prior to the show if a veterinarian certifies the registered horse unsound. This must be done by February 15, 2025.
6. Sponsor Thank You Letter with stamped and addressed envelope are due at check in. NO EXCEPTIONS. Show coordinators will provide names and addresses of our horse show sponsors prior to show and will be available if you have any questions. Thank you letter information will be given to you when you turn in your record book the week prior to Fair.
7. Only exhibitors will be allowed to ride while horses are on the grounds.
8. All exhibitors are required to wear an SEI or SEI/ASTM approved safety equestrian helmet with fastened chin harness whenever they are on a horse. Failure to obey this rule will result in immediate disqualification and the exhibitor and their horse must leave the fair grounds.
9. All horses entering show grounds must be accompanied by a negative test for EIA made within the last twelve (12) months. The horse's name on both the Coggins papers and entry form must be the same. Accession number must be recorded on the show entry form.
10. The public address system is used to help the show move as smoothly as possible, but it is only a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the contestants to know when they are required to be in the make-up area or arena. There will be a two (2) minute final call.
11. Riders are expected to be neat, clean, attentive, and courteous as all times. Chaps are optional. Long sleeved shirts, pants, boots (no tennis shoes), and helmets are required.
12. Any questions regarding tack, bits, and attire will go to the judge for verification.

### **CLASSES**

13. The Show Coordinators may combine or divide classes for the benefit of the overall show.
14. The show schedule is subject to change depending on the number of entrants in each division.
15. A one (1) minute gate call will be strictly enforced.
16. All classes will be held in the covered arena unless announced otherwise.
17. Trail may be held in back area of show grounds, weather and equipment permitting. Absolutely NO schooling on trail course.
18. Warm-up will be allowed for all jumping horses.

19. Beginner classes limited to first or second year showing for horse or rider. May not enter any classes requiring a lope or canter.

### **AWARDS**

20. The Show Coordinator reserves the right to withhold awards if there is not sufficient competition.
21. Premiums may be awarded after all sponsorship has been collected and all expenses have been paid on individual shows and events.
22. Must show in corresponding "Showmanship/Ground Handling" Class to be eligible for High Point.
23. Same horse and rider only eligible for one High Point.

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**Western** – Junior & Senior  
**Speed Event** – One Award Only  
**Ranch Event** – One Award Only  
**Walk/Trot** – One Award Only

**Record Books:** 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>th</sup> in Juniors, Intermediate, & Senior

**Skill-a-thon:** 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>th</sup> in Juniors, Intermediate, & Senior
