**THE GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SOUTHEASTERN YOUTH FAIR APPLY TO ALL SHOWS AND CONTESTS.**

**IN ADDITION, THE PLANT ID CONTEST ALSO HAS THE FOLLOWING RULES:**

1. Open to individuals or teams.
2. Teams must consist of 3 or 4 contestants representing a Club or Chapter.
3. Contestants may participate as both an individual as well as a team member.
4. If possible, all team members should participate at the same time.

## **CLASSES**

5. Contestants will be divided into Junior, Intermediate and Senior divisions.
6. The specimens to be identified will come from the Official Southeastern Youth Fair "Plant List" which is on the following page.
7. Juniors must identify a total of 20 plants or parts of plants taken from the Junior List.
8. Intermediates must identify a total of 30 plants or parts of plants taken from both the Junior and Intermediate Lists.
9. Seniors must identify a total of 40 plants, parts of plants, or seeds taken from all three (3) lists as well as identifying selected scientific names.

## **CONTEST DAY**

10. No talking is permitted during the contest.
11. No handling of the plants or parts of the plants is allowed.
12. Placings will be determined by the following scores:
  - a. 1<sup>st</sup> place: 90 – 100
  - b. 2<sup>nd</sup> place: 80 – 89
  - c. 3<sup>rd</sup> place: 70 – 79
13. Team scores will be determined by the total score of all members divided by three (3). If the team consists of four (4) members, the lowest score will be dropped.

## **AWARDS**

14. The Show Coordinator reserves the right to withhold awards if there is not sufficient competition.
15. Awards will be determined by the scoring listed in #12 above.
16. Premiums may be awarded after all sponsorship has been collected and all expenses have been paid on individual shows & events.
