1. The SEYF General Rules and Regulations apply to this show.
2. All exhibitors MUST attend the Mandatory Online Training by September 10, 2021 and show proof with Certificate of Completion if they wish to participate. All Market Animal Entry forms are due by September 10, 2021.
3. Lambs may be purchased from any source, not limited to Florida.

TAGGING DAY

4. You must bring the market lamb to the Livestock Pavilion on **Wednesday, October 27, 2021** to have it tagged and weighed.

SHEARING

5. Shearing of all show lambs will be available before the Fair at the Livestock Pavilion for a fee. Dates, times and fees will be posted on the website.

SHOW DAY

6. PROJECT SUMMARY PAGES are due NO LATER THAN 10:30am on show day.
 - If you are raising a ewe for the Market Lamb Show and will also be showing that ewe in the Breeding Lamb Show, you may enter an optional Animal Record Book for the Breeding Show in addition to the mandatory Market Animal Record Book. See Calendar of Events for dates of when Record books are due to be turned in to the SEYF office.
7. Each exhibitor will be allowed to show only one (1) lamb in the Market show.
8. ALL Lambs must weigh a minimum of 70 lbs.
9. Any ewe that has lambled will be ineligible to show.
10. The Lamb Committee reserves the right to review any entries, and may excuse any lamb from the Show and/or Sale.
11. Any ewe that is pregnant at the show will not be eligible to be sold for slaughter.
12. Lambs that turn out to be rams after selection must be castrated and healed to be eligible to show and sell.
13. Lambs will be shown with or without a halter, at the judge's discretion.
14. No dog collars or similar will be allowed.
15. Exhibitors will be judged on showmanship simultaneously while showing in their market class.
16. Classes will be determined after all lambs have been weighed on the day of the show.

AUCTION

17. All lambs are consigned to the auction unless designated otherwise on the original entry form. If deciding not to sell, you MUST communicate to Fair staff at Final Weigh-In. **All decisions (regarding sale or no-sale) are considered FINAL at final weigh-in.**
18. All lambs will be sold to the highest bidder.
19. Any disputes will be settled by the auctioneer.

AWARDS

20. The Show Coordinator reserves the right to withhold awards if there is not sufficient competition.
21. Premiums may be awarded after all sponsorship has been collected and all expenses have been paid.
