- **IMPORTANT DATES:**
- 1. The SEYF General Rules and Regulations apply to this show.
- 2. All exhibitors MUST complete the Mandatory Online Training by the posted deadline and show proof with Certificate of Completion if they wish to participate. All Market Animal Entry forms are due by the posted deadline on the Calendar of Events (found on seyfair.com website).
- 3. Scrapie tag is required for animal identification. See Animal Inspection Rules 5C-4.055 goats or sheep. ALL ANIMALS ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE A CURRENT VETERINARIAN HEALTH CERTIFICATE ON SHOW DAY. You must have these already completed and with you at final check-in. A veterinarian will not be available at check-in.
- 4. Lambs may be purchased from any source, not limited to Florida.

TAGGING DAY

- 5. You must bring the market lamb to the Livestock Pavilion on Saturday, October 14, 2023 to have it tagged and weiahed.
- 6. The Committee will classify your lamb as either Black Face or All Other Breed at initial weigh-in and it will be final decision.

SHEARING

- 7. Shearing of all show lambs may be available before the Fair at the Livestock Pavilion for a fee. Dates, times and fees will be posted on the website.
- 8. All clipping done on fairgrounds must be done outside of the livestock barn. No shearing or clipping will be allowed inside stalls or barn aisles.

SHOW DAY

- PROJECT SUMMARY PAGES are due NO LATER THAN 10:30am on show day. 9.
- If you are raising a ewe for the Market Lamb Show and will also be showing that ewe in the Breeding Lamb Show, you may enter an optional Animal Record Book for the Breeding Show in addition to the mandatory Market Animal Record Book. See Calendar of Events for dates of when Record books are due to be turned in to the SEYF office.
- 10. Each exhibitor will be allowed to show only one (1) lamb in the Market show.
- 11. ALL Lambs must weigh a minimum of 70 lbs.
- 12. Any ewe that has lambed will be ineligible to show.
- 13. The Lamb Committee reserves the right to review any entries and may excuse any lamb from the Show and/or Sale.
- 14. Any ewe that is pregnant at the show will not be eligible to be sold for slaughter.
- 15. Lambs that turn out to be rams after selection must be castrated and healed to be eligible to show and sell.
- 16. Lambs will be shown with or without a halter, at the judge's discretion.
- 17. Exhibitor must wear the official dress of his/her organization. (see General Rules #24)
- 18. All exhibitors will participate in/be judged on showmanship at the end of the show.
- 19. Classes will be determined after all lambs have been weighed on the day of the show.

AUCTION

20. All lambs are consigned to the auction, including ewes shown in the market show. No exceptions.

- 21. All lambs will be sold to the highest bidder.
- 22. Any disputes will be settled by the auctioneer.

AWARDS

- 23. The Show Coordinator reserves the right to withhold awards if there is not sufficient competition.
- 24. Premiums may be awarded after all sponsorship has been collected and all expenses have been paid.
