ALL PLANTS MUST BE IN THE CARE OF THE EXHIBITOR in November on Entry Deadline Date.

EXCEPTION: Entries in Fresh Floral, Terrarium, Creative Container, Vegetable categories, and Dish Garden classes. See Rule #4

ENTRY AND ELIGIBILITY

1. The SEYF General Rules & Regulations apply to this show.
2. This show is for live plants; edible fruits and vegetables only. All plants must be free of insects and disease.
3. All exhibits, with the exception of exhibits in the Fresh Floral Arrangement, Creative Container, Vegetable categories, Terrarium, and both Dish Garden classes, must be in the care of the exhibitor by the entry deadline date.
4. All exhibits must be the work of, or grown by, the exhibitor.
5. Class 8 – Vegetables or Fruits must be home grown. The edible portion of the vegetable or fruit should be displayed. Each exhibit should have four (4) items of the same type and size with the exception of broccoli, cauliflower and cabbage. Only two (2) of each are required.
6. Wall hangings and handcrafted flowers are not permitted.
7. The exhibitor is responsible for watering his/her own plants during the Fair.
8. Only one (1) exhibit per class is allowed each exhibitor.
9. The Southeastern Youth Fair will assume no responsibility or liability for the damage or loss of articles exhibited. Breakable containers are to be used at your own risk and antique or irreplaceable pieces should not be used.

CLASSES

10. Based on the number of entries, the Show Coordinator may create or combine classes. Each class is divided into Junior, Intermediate and Senior divisions:
 - 1) Hanging Baskets
 - 2) Foliage Plants (not flowering)
 - 3) Terrariums
 - 4) Foliage Dish Gardens
 - 5) Cacti or Succulent Dish Garden
 - 6) Cacti or Succulent individual plants
 - 7) Vegetables or Fruits – edible portion
 - 8) Vegetable or Fruits – living plant
 - 9) Fresh Cut Floral Arrangements-no roots, silk or dried
 - 10) Creative Container Gardening
 - 11) Flowering Plants/ Miscellaneous

AWARDS

13. The Show Coordinator reserves the right to withhold awards if there is not sufficient competition or, if in the opinion of the judges, the quality of work does not merit an award.
14. Premiums may be awarded after all sponsorship has been collected and all expenses have been paid on individual shows & events.

All exhibitors will receive a Blue, Red or White participation ribbon.
